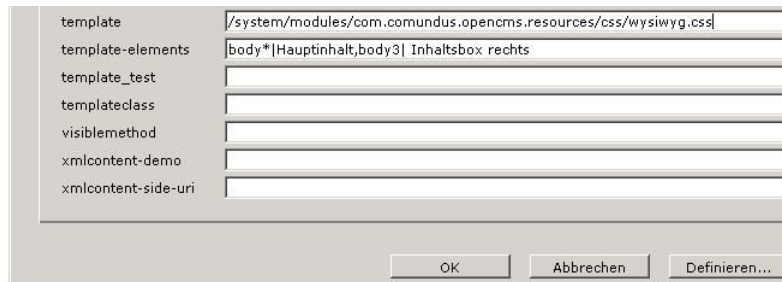

1. create an OpenCms template
2. include your stylesheet like this:

```
<link rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" href="wysiwyg.css">
```

3. and in order to work in the WYSIWYG editor, add the path to your stylesheet in the template property of your template



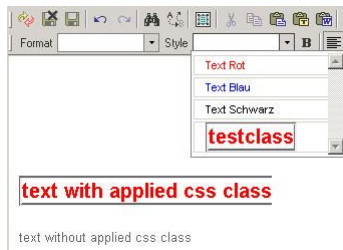
4. in order to have your STYLES select box create a file named wysiwyg.css_style.xml in the same directory (an example of such a file is shipped with OpenCms. You can find it in /system/workplace/resources/editors/fckeditor/fckstyles.xml)



5. to use your own css class in the WYSIWYG-Editor you have to
 - 5.1 create a css class in your css file (wysiwyg.css)
 - 5.2 configure this class in wysiwyg.css_style.xml as follows:

<?xml version="1.0" encoding="utf-8" ?>
<Styles>
  <Style name="Text Rot" element="span">
    <Attribute name="style" value="color: #ff0000;" />
  </Style>
  <Style name="Text Blau" element="span">
    <Attribute name="style" value="color: #0000ff;" />
  </Style>
  <Style name="Text Schwarz" element="span">
    <Attribute name="style" value="color: #000000;" />
  </Style>
  <Style name="testclass" element="span">
    <Attribute name="class" value="testclass" />
  </Style>
</Styles>
```
